Moose Legion Directors and Moose Legionnaires,

As announced in Nashville - The International Moose Legion Council formally approved the adoption of a special fund raising project for **2010-2011** of replacing at least 51 of the cement light poles on the Mooseheart campus. There are some 111 poles total and nearly half are badly deteriorated (some have had to be removed from service completely for safety) and are in need of replacement.

The total estimated project cost of **\$100,000.00** is pro rated over the entire International Moose Legion active membership as of April 30, 2010. The Moose Legion Council is asking each Moose Legion to commit \$1.75 per Moose Legionnaire over this current fiscal year period.

The following discount program was also approved:

- Moose Legions completing their total commitment by November 30, 2010 will receive a twenty percent (20%) discount on their share.
- Moose Legions completing their total commitment by February 28, 2011 will receive a ten percent (10%) discount on their share.

Blue Ridge Moose Legion No. 82 has been assigned a project commitment and discounted amount based on the following formula:

Total good standing on rolls April 30, 2010 is $825 \times \$1.75 = \$1,443.75$.

Total commitment @ 20% discount if paid by November 30, 2010 = **\$1,155.00**.

Total commitment @ 10% discount if paid by February 28, 2011 = **\$1,299.38**.


Each Moose Legion is asked to get the local Lodge Moose Legion Committees involved with the fundraising by establishing monetary goals based on the number of Moose Legionnaires in each Lodge. Enthusiasm and friendly competition can be created through proper promotion of this project.

Funds received for this project from all sources shall be classified as "Moose Legion - MHT Street Light Poles", under Donations Received in QuickBooks. All checks remitted to International should be made payable to Moose Charities and earmarked "Moose Legion - MHT Street Light Poles".


