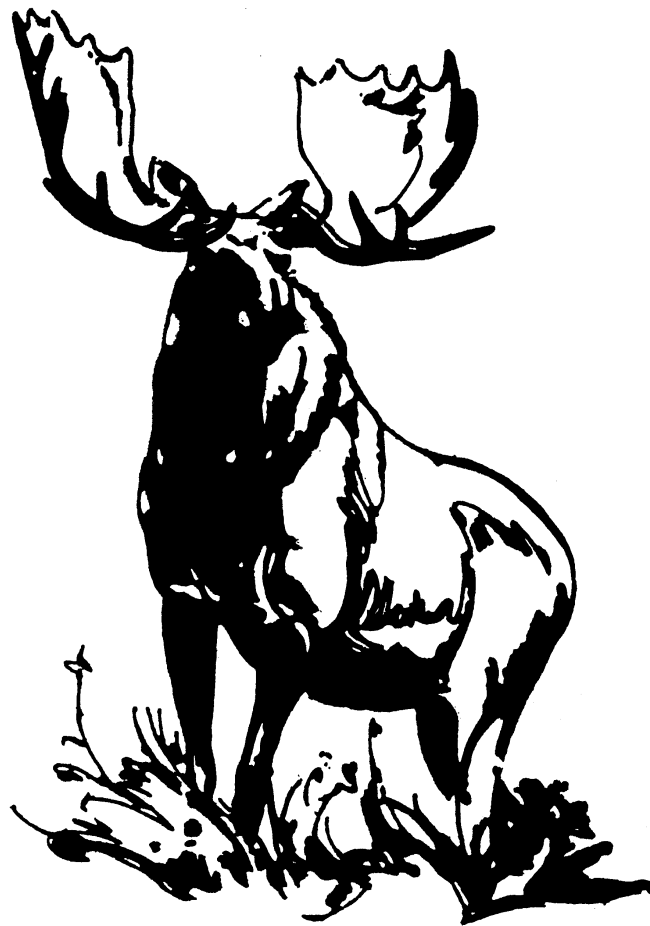

PULL-TAB POLICY

The pull-tab policy for Moose Lodge #2165 in regards to turning in winning tickets is as follows:

Any instant winners (77 or 55, any instant picture winners \$20, \$25, \$50, etc.) need to be turned into the bartender and paid before that game is closed by the bartender. The bartender will always make last call for any instant winners to be turned in. Once the bartender closes a game, the only ticket that will be paid after that is the winning ticket for the seal number that was called.

The winning seal card number will be posted on the board behind the bar. Members will have 30 days from the date of the closing of the game to claim the winning money for that game.

If a game goes 30 days unpaid, it will be taken off the board and the money will be turned into the lodge general fund.

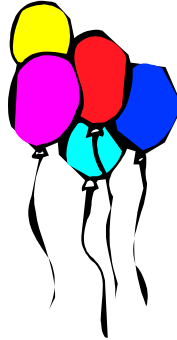

GLAUCOMA

About two percent of Americans age 40 years and older, 2.2 million, have glaucoma. It is the leading cause of preventable blindness in the United States.

What is glaucoma? Glaucoma is a group of eye diseases that damage the optic nerve. The optic nerve carries information from the eye to the brain and is located in the back of the eye. When the nerve is damaged, you can lose your vision.

What are the types of glaucoma? There are two types of glaucoma. The first and most common is open-angle glaucoma. The optic nerve is damaged bit by bit which leads to the loss of eyesight. One eye may be affected more than the other. Sometimes much of your eyesight may be lost before you notice it. The second and less common is closed-angle glaucoma. In this type of glaucoma, the colored part of the eye or iris and the lens block movement of fluid between the parts of the eye. Pressure builds up and presses on the drainage system of the eye.

What are the risk factors? Your risk for glaucoma rises after age 40. Blacks are more likely than whites to get the disease. You also are at increased risk if you have diabetes or a close family member has had glaucoma.

What causes glaucoma? Damage to the optic nerve is often caused by increased intraocular (within the eye) pressure. Increased pressure can be caused by extra fluid that builds up in the eye. This fluid build-up occurs because the eye makes too much fluid or the fluid cannot drain. However, glaucoma can occur without increased intraocular pressure. In these cases, the cause may not be found. You also can get glaucoma after an eye injury, after eye surgery, or because of an eye tumor.

What are the symptoms? With open-angle glaucoma the only symptom you may notice is loss of vision and you may not notice until it is serious. The reason you may not notice is because, at first, the eye that is not affected makes up for the loss. Side vision is often lost before central vision. With closed-angle glaucoma symptoms can be mild. You may get blurred vision that lasts only for a sort time. Severe signs include longer-lasting episodes of blurred vision or pain in or around the eye. You also may see colored halos around lights, have red eyes, or feel sick to your stomach and vomit.

How is glaucoma diagnosed? If you are under 40 and have no known risk factors, you need to have an eye exam that includes tests for glaucoma every 5 to 10 years. These tests may be done by an optometrist or an ophthalmologist. If there is a history of glaucoma in your family or if you have other risk factors for glaucoma, talk with your doctor about having more frequent exams. If you are at increased risk, you need to have regular eye exams, by an ophthalmologist.

How is glaucoma treated? Glaucoma is usually treated with eye drop medication. If you have prescribed eye drops, be sure to follow a daily schedule so that they work the way they should. You will likely need to take medicine for the rest of your life.

Glaucoma may need to be treated by surgery. There are three basic types of surgery: (1) Surgery to increase drainage of fluid from the eye. This type of surgery involves making an opening that allows fluid to drain from the eye; (2) Surgery to prevent closure of the drainage angle. This procedure involves making a new opening in the iris that allow fluid to flow through they eye; and (3) Surgery to decrease the amount of fluid produced in the eye. When other surgery fails to improve the flow of fluid from the eye, procedures to destroy the part of the eye that produces fluid can be done. Procedures that decrease fluid in the eye are used only for people with severe glaucoma that has not gotten better after they have tried medicines or other forms of surgery.

Treatment cannot bring back vision that has been lost but it can keep your vision for getting worse. You need that vision to enjoy the football season and all of the other activities at the lodge.

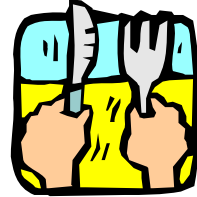
