'TIS THE SEASON TO BE GIVING!

As the holiday season approaches, let us remember our purpose as Moose Members which is to help others who may not have it as good as ourselves due to no fault of their own. Sometimes life can be a little rough and it is our job as Moose members to smooth out those rough spots.

Moose lodges throughout the fraternity are always doing projects to help others by raising funds, collecting food and clothing, or many, many other projects to make their communities better places in which to live. And let us not forget our own Moose Charities and our children at Mooseheart and seniors at Moosehaven when it comes time to give a little extra.

We have fundraisers throughout the year for many projects and we step up those projects this time of year. With the holidays of Thanksgiving and Christmas we often are more in tune with those who may not be able to give their families a special time due to economic conditions or health reasons. It is up to us as Moose members to look for these people and try to help where we can.

We are beginning the month with a bus trip in coordination with Vinton 1121 to help out a couple of our fellow lodges on Saturday November 5th. The

trip will begin at Vinton for breakfast, head to Smith Mountain Lake 2346 for lunch, and finish at Bassett 383 for dinner. Cost of the trip is \$25 and does not include meals. There will be beverages on the bus along with various fundraising games.

There will be a benefit for the Floyd family on November 11th featuring the "Bluegrass Brothers". The Floyd family, mother, father, and two children, lost their home in a fire in October. The cost of admission is a donation and there will be a 50/50 and other fundraising activities during the dance.

We collect food all year long for the Salem Food Pantry and we are stepping it up a notch for Thanksgiving by committing to supplying them fifty turkeys so that fifty families who would otherwise be unable to celebrate Thanksgiving with a decent meal will now be able to do so. We are asking our members to bring a turkey to the lodge for this collection. If an individual cannot do so find a brother or sister and pool your money and do it together!

We are also carrying on a tradition at our lodge of providing a place for those who may not have a family in the area to celebrate Thanksgiving with by opening our Lodge for a free Thanksgiving dinner. The only thing we ask is that those who are able bring a dish or dessert

for all to share. This event is also open to all on duty fire, police and rescue personnel.

The WOTM is putting up an Angel Tree for members to give gifts to children who may not otherwise receive a Christmas so please be generous in your giving.

Our Lodge will be an official drop off point for the Marine Corps "Toy For Tots" program so please bring a new unwrapped toy for the collection box. We are also holding a "Toys for Tot's Band Jam" on Saturday December 10th featuring the band "The Mad Iguanas" and other local bands and musicians. Admission is an unwrapped toy valued at \$10 or more or \$10 cash donation. Help us put smiles upon the faces of children on Christmas morning by participating in this great event!

As you can see the next couple of months will be a busy time at our Lodge so please come in and join in on the fun! Don't let this be the only time you come in since we have things like this going on all year long! Remember, it is better to give than to receive and what better place to do that than at the Moose! 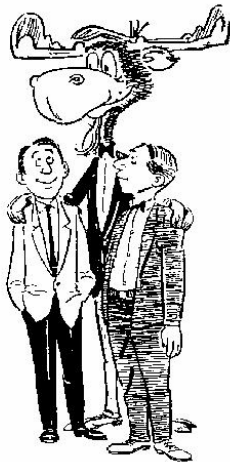
